

PUBLIC NOTICE

The Lac du Flambeau Tribal Natural Resources Department has received an application regarding a shoreline stabilization project. The Kerler project involves placing rock riprap below the ordinary high water mark on property located on Little Crawling Stone Lake in the Town of Lac du Flambeau (SE/SW Sec. 20 T40N R5E) within the exterior boundaries of the Lac du Flambeau Indian Reservation.

In accordance with Section 401 of the Clean Water Act (CWA), the Lac du Flambeau Band of Lake Superior Chippewa Indians (Tribe) is reviewing the application to determine if the activities associated with the Kerler Riprap Project will be consistent with the current Water Quality Standards established by the Tribe.

The certification would not authorize impacts to cultural, historical, or archeological features or sites, or properties that may be eligible for such listing.

The Tribe seeks comments of the proposed 401 Certification for activities associated with the Kerler Riprap Project. Requests for additional information and written comments can be sent via letter or email to:
