POSITION: Aquatic Invasive Species Boat Inspector

DURATION: 16 hours/week, May 24th to August 25th 2019; not to exceed 240 hours maximum

Position Summary:

This position is responsible for inspecting boats and informing boaters at the Gunlock & Shishebogama Lakes landing about aquatic invasive species. In addition the position will be responsible for educating the public about the importance of keeping aquatic invasive species out of Tribal waters. This position will be working on weekends.

This is a one-time seasonal position with no benefits.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- 18 years of age or older
- Must have a valid driver's license
- Must have access to a vehicle
- High School Diploma or Graduate Equivalency Diploma (GED)
- Able to work weekend
- Must be able to effectively communicate with the public and diplomatically handle situations of conflict
- Must be able to interact well and display respect towards all people
- Must be able to work independently
- Able to fill out forms neatly and keep orderly records
- Must be able to understand and convey the importance of keeping aquatic invasive species out of the water bodies
- Must submit to and pass drug test
- Must be of physical condition to be able to stand for long periods of time out side in all weather conditions
- Must have an interest in protecting Tribal water resources

- Able to use a computer and internet

Duties and Responsibilities:

- 80% - Run boat inspection program at the Gunlock/Shishebogama Boat Landing
 - Educate public about aquatic invasive species
 - Record information from boaters
- 10% - Enter data from data sheets into computer
- 10% - Organize and prepare educational material for aquatic invasive species boat inspection program.
